#### **Exhibiting Opportunities**

The Roswell (NM) Museum, in partnership with the Pecos Valley Potters Guild, invites artists, artisans, contemporary craftspeople and makers to apply to the <u>third annual Roswell Museum Holiday Artisan Market</u>, a juried art exhibition, sale, and fundraiser held at the Roswell Museum. Entry deadline: August 4, 2023. Entry fee: \$35.00.

The Brownsville (TX) Museum of Fine Art seeks entries for its <u>48<sup>th</sup> International Art Show</u>. A wide range of mediums are eligible for submission. Entry deadline: August 6, 2023. Entry fee: \$40.00.

The Round Rock (TX) Arts Council invites artists to celebrate and examine how <u>Adornment</u> is part of our daily lives, history, culture, theatre, festivals, and self-expression. All 2D and 3D media will be considered. Entry deadline: August 9. Entry fee: \$20.00.

The Albuquerque Museum has opened the call for entries to its 33<sup>rd</sup> annual Arts Thrive Exhibition and Benefit. The primary goal for the ArtsThrive Art Exhibition and Benefit is to raise funds for the Albuquerque Museum. The secondary goal is showcasing participants and their art in a desirable, highly public platform providing the opportunity to sell their art at a world-class museum. Entry deadline: August 13, 2023. Entry fee: \$25.00.

<u>New Mexico's "Art in Public Places"</u> seeks submissions of work for consideration in this program of placing art by New Mexico artists in public buildings across the state. Artists must reside in New Mexico to qualify for this program. Up to three works may be submitted, with very detailed instructions. Entry deadline: August 31, 2023.

<u>Light Art Space in Silver City, NM</u> invites submissions for their exhibition <u>H2O: Shifting Currents</u>. Submitted work should represent the artists' view of water and the shifting currents of life. All entries must be handmade prints using traditional printmaking and/or photographic processes and created in the last 5 years. Experimental and 3D work is encouraged. A wide variety of listed process used to create handmade prints will be considered for acceptance, so it is essential that artists consult the list before entering. Entry deadline: September 3, 2023. Entry fee: \$35.00 for up to three entries; \$5.00 for each additional entry up to a total of 10.

The Stephen F. Austin State University (TX) seeks submissions for its <u>Eleventh Refined Competition and Exhibition</u>. They want to showcase contemporary works that honor the diverse field of metalworking and jewelry. Jewelry, utensils, adornment, hollowware, furniture, installation, and sculpture will be considered. Jury process includes \$1,500 in awards. Entry deadline: September 3, 2023. Entry fee: \$30.00.

Artworks Center for Contemporary Art in Loveland, CO, seeks entries for <u>Lore</u>, in which artists will explore themes of lore and family narratives. Entry deadline: September 15, 2023. Entry fee: \$35.00.

The Sedona, AZ Arts Center is accepting entries for its exhibit, <u>Contemporary Surrealism</u>. Monetary awards are included in the jurying process. Entry deadline: September 29, 2023. Entry fee: \$30.00.

The <u>2023 Keller Award</u> is accepting applicants for a combination of online, print and physical exhibitions. Entry deadline: September 30, 2023. Entry fee: \$45.00 for five entries.

Blue Line Gallery in Roseville, CA seeks artists from all art practices to submit work for its exhibit, <u>Natural Elements</u>. This show will facilitate an exploration of the intrinsic connection between art and the wonders of the natural world. Entry deadline: October 7, 2023. Entry fee: \$25.00.

Proposals for full-gallery exhibitions during 2025 of fine craft, furniture, glass, jewelry, metal, mixed media, paper, wood are sought by the 108|Contemporary Gallery in the Tulsa Arts District. Entry deadline: December 1, 2023.

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## Artists' Residencies

<u>Centrum Residencies</u> – Port Townsend, WA. Creative professionals from all disciplines and backgrounds can take advantage of charming cabins, studio spaces, and a rich array of resources. Residents can expect semi-rustic experiences in comfortable cabins or apartments.

<u>Vashon Artist Residency</u> – Vashon Island, WA. This residency provides a diverse group of artists the time and space to create, the opportunity to engage with other residents and the experience of living and working amidst the ecology and community of Vashon Island, located on the beautiful Salish Sea in Washington State.

<u>Green Box Residency</u> – Green Mountain Falls, CO. The Green Box Artist in Residency program offers artists of national and international stature, from diverse disciplines, and at any stage in their career the opportunity to develop, create, and/or present new works while living in and engaging with the community of Green Mountain Falls, a beautiful small mountain community located in Ute Pass, by the foothills of Pikes Peak.

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### **Available Grants for Artists**

The application cycle is open for <u>Fusion Art's Grant for Artistic Excellence 2023</u>, available for applications from new, emerging and professional artists, at least 18 year old, who show exceptional creative ability in their chosen craft. These

unrestricted monetary grants of \$500 will be given to up to 3 artists to help with expenses involved with the creation of their art and to help advance their careers. The grants can be used for any expense including, but not limited to, art supplies, website development, marketing and promotion efforts, travel, entering juried art shows, etc. These grants are not based on financial need and are strictly based on artistic merit. Entry deadline: September 15, 2023. Entry fee: \$45.00.

The Pollock-Krasner Foundation, established as part of Lee Krasner's legacy, supports and strengthens the creative lives of artists. The Pollock-Krasner Foundation offers a competitive grant for artists with extensive exhibition records; awards range from \$5,000 to \$30,000, depending on need and circumstance. This grant has a long list of impressive alumni. Since its start in 1985, the foundation has issued over \$65 million in grants to artists in over 77 countries. Requirements for consideration are the application form, a current resume including an exhibition record, and ten digital images of current work with a corresponding identification list.
