For 2024, the EACA Board has appointed two people to be Co-Directors of the Studio Tour. Debbie Parke, EACA Communications Chair and a member of the 2023 Planning Team, has joined Pat Rasmussen, 2023 Tour Director. We have already begun planning for the 2024 Studio Tour and will meet with the full planning team on Feb. 20th. We're excited that so many wonderful team members from the 2023 Tour will remain on the team and we will be adding several new members to fill vacancies and new positions that are the result of restructuring the committees to lessen the load for people.

The tour will be held the 3rd weekend in September with the Opening Reception and Preview Gallery on Friday, Sept. 20th. The individual studios and the Preview Gallery will be open on Saturday, Sept. 21 and Sunday, Sept. 22.

Tour applications will begin on Friday, April 5 and end on Friday, April 26. Returning artists can begin contacting sponsors at any time, especially if they are corporate sponsors who need a lot of time for approval. The Sponsorship forms are available on the EACA website: eldoradoarts.com

Membership Renewal

The term of membership at EACA coincides with each calendar year. For this reason, members must renew their dues at each New Year. If you have not already done so, please go to the EACA website (<u>www.eldoradoarts.org</u>) and navigate to the tab for Member Activities. Under this tab is the link for <u>Membership Submission & Payment</u>. On that page you can enter your information and issue a payment with a credit or debit card. Member dues are currently \$25.00, a very modest expense for the association's services.

Prompt renewals are of great benefit to EACA. They enable accurate budgeting for the year, while also establishing with certainty the active members of the association – for example, to be certain that any online votes or other administrative work of the association is directed to current members. Current membership is also mandatory for participation in any of the exhibiting events, such as the Spring or Winter shows and the Studio Tour.

Since only current members are entitled to EACA communications, such as the newsletter or other email updates, artists not in good standing will be removed from the EACA email list after February 24.

EACA Art Book Club

The Art Book Club has had four meetings. As you might expect from a group of artists, there are few rules, plenty of wine, and the conversation rarely moves in a straight line. It's good to hang out with kindred souls.

At the first two meetings, in September and October, the group read two different books about creativity and the artistic process. While somewhat interesting, they were felt to be preaching to the choir.

The November meeting was dedicated to learning about German artist Anselm Kiefer. This was inspired by one of the members having seen the film "Anselm" at the SF Film Festival. Rather than reading a specific book the members researched his life and work via the web.

In January we went as a group to see the film, in 3-D, at the Violet Crown Theater. It is a gorgeous romp through Anselm's world.

The January meeting focused on artist Judy Chicago, with members choosing any book about her they wished. We were inspired to focus on her because we learned that she now lives in Belen, NM and has a gallery there. We are planning a field trip once the snow melts.

For the February meeting members are reading *The Vivisector* by Patrick White. The book details the lifelong creative journey of fictional artist/painter Hurtle Duffield.

So, as you can see, the Book Club provides camaraderie, encourages learning and discussion of art related topics and does so in a flexible format that suits the personalities of its artist members. (If you can imagine a herd of cats discussing the mousing techniques of the masters you've got a good insight into the club.)

Calls for Entry

<u>Core Art Space in Denver</u> seeks entries for "<u>Works on Paper – Make Your Mark</u>." All print techniques and types of paper and paper-like substrates, ranging from traditional to experimental and digital, are allowed (except giclee reproductions). Entry deadline: February 5, 2024. Entry fee: \$35.00.

<u>Art Moziak Fine Art Gallery</u> (Santa Fe) calls for submissions to their exhibit, "<u>Art Unleashed</u>." The gallery invites artists of all backgrounds to submit entries, noting that they especially value the contributions of New Mexico's diversified and flourishing arts community. They hope that the call for entries may help to draw attention to the abundance of creative ability in the area and give local artists a chance to be seen. Entry deadline: February 22, 2024. Entry fee: \$45.00.

Foto Forum of Santa Fe has announced an open call for their 2024 Photography Award, an annual, international competition open to emerging and established artists. The judging process includes awarding some prizes and a solo exhibition. Entry deadline: March 5, 2024. Entry fee: \$25.00.

Blue Line Arts invites entries in their annual show, <u>Off Center</u>. This competition celebrates the timeless tradition of ceramic art but also welcomes artists' unique artistic vision. This year's competition focuses on installation artworks and large-scale ceramics, accommodating monumental and multi-part creations. Cash prizes will be awarded. Entry deadline: February 26, 2024. Entry fee: \$35.00.

<u>The Strata Gallery</u> (Santa Fe) invites all emerging artists to submit entries for their <u>Emerging Artists Membership</u> <u>Program</u>. Entry deadline: March 30, 2024. Entry fee: \$35.00.

Las Laguna Gallery is seeking works that explore plants. Any works that highlights flowers, plants, trees, leaves, cactus, succulents, etc. will be considered. A wide range of artistic mediums will be considered. Entry deadline: March 30, 2024. Entry fee: \$35.00.

Residencies

The <u>Sonoma (CA) Community Center</u> offers a self-directed program for emerging or established ceramic artists. Two allinclusive residencies offered each year for potters and ceramic sculptors. The program is open to all ceramic artists living within the United States and culminates with a solo gallery exhibition at the end of the residency period. In exchange for a monthly stipend of \$750, lodging, firings, glazes, and 24-hour studio access, the artist-in-residence is expected to work 20 hours per week. Application deadline: Feb 15, 2024. Entry fee: \$15.00 to \$30.00.

The <u>SCG ART program</u> brings established artists to Placer County (CA) for the purpose of teaching and sharing their artistic talents and experience to the greater community. This is the first national call for this annual residency opportunity, open to all U.S.-based artists. This residency offers a large studio space, funding for projects, and the opportunity to teach workshops in a formal setting. Application deadline: March 1, 2024. No stated entry fee.

The application period for the <u>Roswell (NM) Artists' Residency</u> is open. Professional visual artists 21 years of age or older, involved in painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, photography, video, digital media, and installation are invited to apply. Artists-in-residence are housed in one of six houses and work in nearby studios. A monthly stipend of \$1,100 is awarded, with a further \$250 for materials. Additional funds are available for couples and families. <u>Application</u> deadline: March 15, 2024.

The National Park Service has opened applications for the <u>Joshua Tree National Park Artist in Residence Program</u>, the purpose of which is to provide opportunities for artists to creatively explore the resources of Joshua Tree National Park, promoting a deeper appreciation of the natural, cultural, and historical resources therein. The residency is open to visual artists, performing artists, musicians, and writers. Selected artist's will be invited for a one-month stay in fall or spring. There are two objectives for this residency. One is to give artists time to explore the park and pursue their own creative practice. The second is for the artist to share their unique perspective of the park's resources with others. Entry deadline: May 31, 2024. No stated entry fee.

WOWArtSci maintains an ongoing application process for week-long self-directed residencies near Taos. Fee: \$635.00.
