STUDIO TOUR PLANNING

Mark your calendars! The 33rd annual Eldorado Studio Tour will take place on the weekend of September 20 and 21, with a Preview Gallery opening and Reception on the evening of September 19.

Running the tour requires significant funding, primarily for advertising. For this reason, every participant is expected to either secure sponsorships or pay an opt-out fee. Additionally, the success of the tour relies heavily on volunteer effort. We are a completely volunteer-based organization; therefore, every artist participating in the tour must contribute by serving on a committee or as a member of the planning team.

The planning team will begin meeting on February 18th this year. Committee chairs will collaborate to create a plan, identify the number of volunteers needed for various tasks, develop a budget for their committee's requirements, and ensure that all tasks are completed on schedule to guarantee a successful tour.

At this time, the planning team is looking for four additional members. Our most urgent need is a Publicity Chair to manage advertising, secure contracts, and collaborate with the committee to ensure that articles, advertising graphics and text are delivered on time. We are also seeking a Flags and Banners Chairperson, a Copywriter, and a Co-Chair for the Studio Tour. Descriptions for these roles were emailed out in January. EACA Membership Renewal

The term of membership at EACA coincides with each calendar year. For this reason, members must renew their dues at each New Year. If you have not already done so, please go to the EACA website (www.eldoradoarts.org) and navigate to the tab for Member Activities. Under this tab is the link for Membership Submission & Payment. On that page you can enter your information and issue a payment with a credit or debit card. Member dues are currently \$25.00, a very modest expense for the association's services.

Prompt renewals are of great benefit to EACA. They enable accurate budgeting for the year, while also establishing with certainty the active members of the association – for example, to be certain that any online votes or other administrative work of the association is directed to current members. Current membership is also mandatory for participation in any of the exhibiting events, such as the Spring or Winter shows and the Studio Tour.

Since only current members are entitled to EACA communications, such as the newsletter or other email updates, artists not in good standing will be removed from the EACA email list after February 28.

You may check your membership status by looking at the online <u>membership directory</u>, which requires the password EACAm3mb3rs.

COMMUNITY ART ACTIVITY

<u>Vista Grande Public Library:</u> Decorative and functional pottery by the Eldorado Senior Center Ceramicists, under the direction of artist Selene Sinclair, are on sale in the display case throughout February. Please support our local artists and the art classes at the facility, located just south of VGPL.

Also on in February: the library's gallery walls feature Helen Becker's award-winning collage art. A 2023 winner of the National Collage Society's annual exhibit award, Becker describes her work as "collage-painting" and her exhibit showcases her interest in shading and shadows, studying the effect of light on objects and surfaces.

A native of Ohio, Becker and her husband moved west after college, in search of wide-open spaces, settling first in Moab (where she was a founding board member of Gallery Moab and helped direct the Plein Air Moab Competition) before moving to New Mexico two and half years ago.

This year, Becker will take part in the 40th Annual Juried Exhibit at the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore. Her art resides in collections across the United States.

There will not be a public reception in January, but, as always, 20% of sales of art in the library benefit VGPL programs and operations.

VGPL Art Exhibits Coordinator, <u>Monica Emrich</u> continues to encourage local artists to exhibit their work. Either two-dimensional or three-dimensional art will be considered for exhibition. More details about the library's exhibiting process can be found at this <u>link</u>.

The program lets participants manage free business listings that are visible to thousands of potential customers, while also providing such participants with future industry-related news and communications, including calls for entry.

Calls for Entry

The San Fernando Valley (CA) Arts & Cultural Center seeks entries for its <u>Spring Forward</u> exhibition. This show explores the concept of moving forward—embracing growth, transformation, and the momentum that propels us into the future. A wide varieties of art media are eligible to enter. Cash awards will be part of the jurying process. Entry deadline: February 9, 2025. Entry fee: \$40.00.

The Epperson Gallery (Crockett, CA) seeks entries for its show entitled Let the Fur and Feathers Fly to celebrate our animal friends: dogs, cats, birds, or anything with fur or feathers. A wide variety of two-dimensional and three-dimensional art (excluding digital art) may be submitted. Cash awards are part of the jurying process. Entry deadline: February 9, 2025. Entry fee: \$40.00.

Artists on the Rise of Denver, CO is seeking artists to participate in a community-centered, technology forward art initiative. Artists are encouraged to submit works that express their personal vision, connect with diverse audiences, and explore the importance of cultural roots and shared experiences. The organizers state, "The call is crafted to create an expansive exposure and revenue opportunity for each selected work." Application deadline: February 28, 2025. Application fee: \$40.00 (\$80.00 for murals).

Foto Forum (Santa Fe) announces its annual call for the <u>2025 Foto Forum Santa Fe Photography Award</u>. The award includes valuable prizes for the first and second place winners. Entry deadline: March 15, 2025. Entry fee: \$35.00.

Workshop Opportunity

The Kipaipai Artist Development Program is offering a Workshop in Joshua Tree (CA), June 6-8, 2025, devoted to professional practices in areas of gallery representation and museum exhibitions, self-promotion, use of social media in promotion, the importance of relevant critical writing, presentation, and identifying and strategizing personal/professional goals. Sixteen participants will be selected from the pool of applicants. Combined tuition and housing fees of \$1,450 are the responsibility of the participating artists. Application deadline: February 10, 2025. Application fee: \$55.00.

Residencies

The <u>Roswell Artist-in-Residence Foundation</u> is accepting applications for its 2026 residencies. The program allows artists unobstructed time to work for extended periods. The program includes studio space, accommodations, and a monthly stipend. Entry deadline: March 15, 2025. Entry fee: \$25.00.

With availability from May through October, Ghost Ranch offers its Estudio Corazon Residencies in 2025. Participants will be expected to pay a fee ranging from \$1,950 to \$4,500, depending on the length of stay. Application deadline: March 9, 2025. Resident artists are housed in casitas with a bedroom and studio. Participants have access to the Ghost Ranch dining facilities. Application fee: \$25.00.

In March, the National Park Service will open applications for the <u>Artist in Residence Program</u> in the Valles Caldera National Preserve. Application requirements may be viewed now. The deadline for applications will be published when the application period opens.
