Open Studio Tour Dates

This year's Eldorado Open Studio Tour is being chaired by Pat Rasmussen. The tour dates are September 23–24, 2023. As with every Studio Tour, a lot of planning, organization and communication lie ahead for the EACA membership – all as necessary for a successful Open Studio Tour as the creation of the art.

In March, there will be a Studio Tour Interest meeting. Applications for tour participation be available April 7 - 21. Additional details, including available staff positions and deadlines for securing sponsorships, will be announced in the coming weeks. Watch your email for details.

Artists' Resources

<u>Guest Speakers:</u> The January 17 EACA General Meeting featured three guest speakers who, together with Vice President Debra Henderlong, shared insights into participation in art festivals and fairs. The guests were potter Magalli Gomez, jewelry artist Victoria Herrera, and photographer Ruben Hernandez. All have experience in displaying and selling their art at festivals. Key points shared by the speakers include:

- Planning requirements:
 - o Use online resources to identify likely festivals. Even a Google search for art fairs and art festivals will provide a good start, but there are online services that can list events (often for a subscription fee).
 - o Evaluate projected audiences against one's own needs to assure a good match for your art.
 - Use a long enough time horizon to ensure the ability to meet the travel and inventory requirements for attendance at any or all of the desired events.
- Production and pricing requirements:
 - Make sure the scheduling leaves adequate production time to enable inventory to be adequate at each fair or festival.
 - Evaluate entry fees and all other participation costs (travel, lodging, booths, tents, tables, etc.) to assure events make business sense.
 - o Consider having art at a variety of price points to attract a full range of prospective buyers.
- Logistics:
 - o Be sure the art can be moved without breakage.
 - O Set-up and break-down can be hard work. Will the event schedule pay off for that effort?
 - O Booth staffing is a challenge if an artist is alone. Be sure to plan how to cover bathroom breaks and to secure meals.
- Learning:
 - o Engage and listen to customers. What are they telling you about your art?
 - o Try to consolidate lessons learned from each event, to make future participation better.

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<u>Nearby Residency:</u> There is an open call-for-entry seeking applications for the Roswell (NM) Artist-in-Residence Program. The Roswell Artist-in-Residence Foundation describes this program as follows:

Well known by visual artists as the "Gift of Time", the Roswell Artist-in-Residence Program was established in 1967 to provide gifted studio-based visual artists with the unique opportunity to

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concentrate on their work in a supportive, collegial environment for an entire year. This gift of time allows artists to work without distraction in an effort to break new ground and focus on individual goals. The Roswell Artist-in-Residence Program's interest is in strengthening the vitality of the visual art in New Mexico and has been a catalyst in broadening community understanding of contemporary art for over fifty years.

The residency houses artists in a complex of six houses and eight studios, which are large, open spaces of approximately 30 x 25 x 10 feet. There is a monthly stipend of \$1,100 with an additional stipend of \$250 for artists' materials. Supplemental funds are also available for supporting families that accompany artists.

The application deadline is March 15, 2023. Go to https://www.rair.org/rair for more information about the program.

<u>EACA President Evie Gauthier provides this brief review of Maria's work and time in EACA:</u> Maria has had a distinguished career as a painter and has spent much of her time painting here in Eldorado.

Maria was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in 1944. She studied painting there and in 1969 moved to New York City. Eventually moving to New Mexico, she and her husband Lucky have split their time between Eldorado and New York. Her first Eldorado Studio Tour was in 2006.

She regularly exhibits in New York, particularly at the Montserrat Contemporary Art in SoHo, the 2/20 Gallery in Chelsea, and Larry Sirolli Fine Art also in Chelsea. Maria's work has been included in numerous invitational exhibitions and group shows. She lists her proudest artistic achievement as her solo show at the United Nations Headquarters in New York in 1998.

In an interview included on her website, <u>mariadeechevarria.com</u>, she describes her approach to art: "It is the way to fulfill my need to create peace, energy and beauty." To be in Maria's presence is, indeed, to experience peace, energy, and beauty. You will be missed. All the best in your next chapter.
